Project Summary

The scope of work consisted of the removal and satisfactory disposal of nearly 4000 tons of gravel and stone from various beach locations spread across a two mile distance. Using sophisticated beach combing equipment, REILLY performed 75% of the contract work with its own forces.

Challenges

The most challenging aspect of this project was the logistical coordination between our on-beach equipment and various off site hauling operators to ensure that we were removing the required tonnage per day in order to ensure an on time delivery of the project. Some other challenges were:

- Aggressive project schedule requirements (NTE 20 day duration)
- Closing off sections of heavily traveled beach areas to pedestrian traffic, utilizing temporary fencing in maximum 1000 foot sections
- Implementing mobile weigh stations along various truck routes
- Implementing full time monitoring system to ensure protection of various federally threatened wildlife species and colonial nesting bird colonies. Coordinate all environmental protection efforts through the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection, Division of Fish and Wildlife, Endangered and Non-Game Species (ENSP) and the US Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS).



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
